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Special Notes

Milepost (MP) "...on the Blue Ridge Parkway are concrete posts etched with numbers marking the distance from Waynesboro, Virginia, at Milepost 0. The last marker is Milepost 469 at the Oconaluftee Visitor Center in Cherokee, North Carolina.

Hike Distance is one way

Hike Difficulty is based on an adult in good physical condition, so you should factor in your age and fitness. The ratings do not consider trail length.

Elevation is provided for two reasons. First, the higher elevation, the colder it is so be prepared to add layers. Second, while computer programs point to the best week for fall foliage, mother nature may have different plans. You can adjust your plans by knowing the correct elevation for maximum color impact.

Photo Rating: It is subjective and for the most part from the book, North Carolina Waterfalls, Kevin Adams. May I suggest going to Flickr and search each location paying attention to the time of year and other photographic data when you scroll down the page.

(Route A) Using Plano as the starting point, it will take 14h19m using East bound Interstate 30 to Interstate 40 (963 miles). Jan and I are not big fans of Interstate 40 due to heavy truck traffic and little to see.

(Route B) An alternative route is Interstate 20 through Atlanta then Interstate 85 (1,003 miles) to Ashville. A variation of this route is the small cities along the way.

(Route C) An alternate route is Interstate 20 to Birmingham and then Interstate 59 to Chattanooga. You can cross over the mountains via "The Dragon. My past trip I did this route and was well rewarded. On the return, I may actually take Interstate 40 to Arkansas for additional fall images and then drop down to Beavers Bend in OK.

Wednesday Morning - October 23

HQ to Cradle of Forestry Overlook (46m\31.4 miles)

Cradle of Forestry Overlook (MP410)

Elevation: 4,710

Golden Hour: 6:43am

Sunrise: 7:43am

"From this vantage point, you'll enjoy a stunning east-facing panoramic view of layered mountains in the distance and the Pisgah National Forest below. Notably, you'll see the iconic Looking Glass Rock, a sheer granite rock face formed around 390 million years ago."

Cradle of Forestry in America Museum is located 5.1 miles back down mountain and has a café. <u>Cradle of Forestry - FIND Outdoors (gofindoutdoors.org)</u>

Fryingpan Mountain Lookout Tower (MP409.6)

Elevation: 5.340

Length of Hike: 1.5 miles (round trip)

Difficulty – Moderate

"South of Asheville, the Blue Ridge Parkway meanders through some exceptionally stunning landscapes. The oddly-named but easily-accessed Fryingpan Mountain is no exception: rising roughly 350 feet from a trailhead on the Parkway, the views from the mountain's summit are sweeping and broad. And, thanks to the historic, 70-foot-tall steel fire lookout tower at the mountain's summit, the views are even better: a short climb up the tower reveals incredible panoramas of the nearby peaks of Looking Glass Rock, Mt Pisgah and Cold Mountain."

French Broad Falls (Mill Shoals) And Bird Rock Falls (47m\27.2 miles)

Elevation: 2,780

Length of Hike: 0

Bird Rock Falls (aka Cathedral Falls) is about ¼ of a mile away.

"French Broad Falls (a.k.a. Mill Shoals Falls) and Bird Rock Falls (Cathedral Falls) are three iconic NC waterfalls that you can reach in one short hike. ... The first two of these amazing waterfalls are literally attached to each other and are collectively known as Mill Shoals. If you have a little more time, a short hike will lead you to the third waterfall (Bird Rock Falls, also known as Cathedral Falls)."

Trail: Gorge Trail – "The Gorge Trail is our favorite because it goes to the bottom, face-to-face with this magnificent waterfall. Only from the river's edge can one fully appreciate the grandeur of any gorge."

Note: "Linville Falls is probably the most famous waterfall on the Blue Ridge Parkway." "Linville Falls ranks at or near the top of any list of North Carolina waterfall superlatives. Whether the category is geology, beauty, human history, natural history, photography, or just overall appeal, few waterfalls in the state can compete with Linville."

Crabtree Falls (MP339) (NC not VA)

Crabtree Falls is "a picture-perfect waterfall, the stream falling over hundreds of tiny ledges over the course of its 70-foot drop."

Special Instructions:

"Directions to Trailhead: The trailhead is no longer at Crabtree Meadows Campground on the Blue Ridge Parkway. The new trailhead is at the old restaurant and gift shot at the campground entrance. It's located at Milepost 339.5, about 8.6 miles south of NC 226 in Little Switzerland and 4.6 miles north of NC 80 at Buck Gap. Turn at the sign for the campground and park anywhere along the circle around the old gift shop. Follow the signs to the start of the trail.

Hike Description: The easily followed trail leads past the old amphitheater to the campground. When you reach the paved campground road, cross the road to the parking lot behind the check-in station. This is the old trailhead. From the far end of the parking lot, the trail descends 800 feet to a T junction. It's a loop hike, so it doesn't matter which way you go. The quickest way to the falls is to the right."

Mount Mitchell Summit (MP349.9)

Elevation: 6,684

You can drive most of the way to the summit from MP355. It is the highest point east of the Mississippi River. Great vista view.

Craggy Gardens – Pinnacle (MP364) – (Not Visitor Center at MP367)

Golden Hour: 5:45pm

Sunset: 6:45pm

Elevation: 5,500

Hike Distance: 1.1 miles – Start from the upper level of the Craggy Dome parking lot

Difficulty - Moderate

One of Jan's favorites.

"The landscape here is what gives this part of the parkway its name – you can follow atmospheric trails through the rocky crags then enjoy an amazing view from the summit. Several hiking trails start from the visitor center"

Craggy Gardens is noted for sunsets.


Breakfast – after Elk shoot, return to Haywood 209 Café parking lot, 3360 Crabtree Rd, Waynesville NC 28785
